Scroll down and on the right hand side click on 2011 Census.

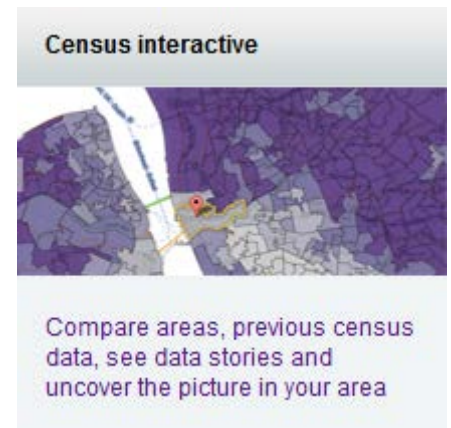
Here you have access to reports, videos, data and data visualisation.

Click on **Census interactive** on the right hand side of the webpage.

Example: Census Map Analysis for Ethnicity

Updated: 2011 Census - Ethnicity



30 Jan - Now updated with small area data: See what patterns in the ethnicity of the United Kingdom have been revealed by the 2011 Census. Enter a postcode or click on the map for a local view. The data starts at Local Authority District (LAD) level, but zoom in or search to see more detailed information (at Lower Super Output Area level).

Click on the title. **Update:2011 Census-Ethnicity**

Type **Leeds** into **Search for a postcode or address** and click on

This will take you to a small area of Leeds that is bounded by a yellow line.

Note the shading on the map.

The key at the bottom right hand side of the map will tell you the percentage of the population the shade represents. So the small area in the yellow boundary has less than 79.1 % of its population White.



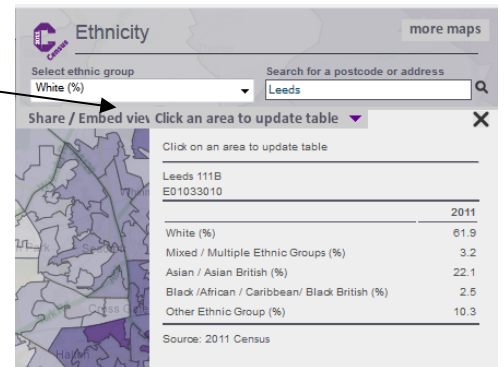

How to use ONS Data Visualisation Census Map Analysis

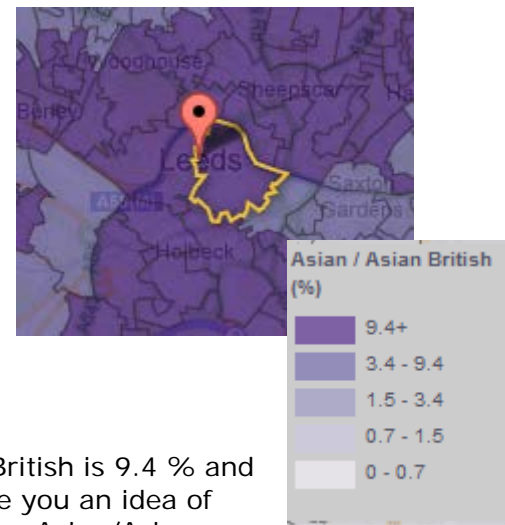
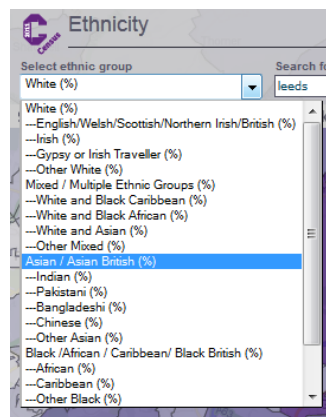
Click on the arrow for **Click an area to update table.**

This will open a table with the percentages of people in that area who are White, Mixed/Multiple Ethnic Groups, Asian/Asian British, Black/African/Caribbean/Black British and Other Ethnic Group. So in this small area of Leeds 22.1 % of the population are Asian/Asian British.



Click on the arrow for **Select ethnic group.**
Select **Asian/Asian British**

Notice that the map's shading has changed and the percentages in the key at the bottom right hand side of the webpage has changed.



This tells us that in this larger area the percentage of Asian/Asian British is 9.4 % and above. But now look at surrounding areas and the shading will give you an idea of the percentage of the population of all of England and Wales who are Asian/Asian British.

You can click and drag the map.

You can also zoom in and zoom out using the the slider.



But this is only a small area of Leeds.
To look at the whole of Leeds.

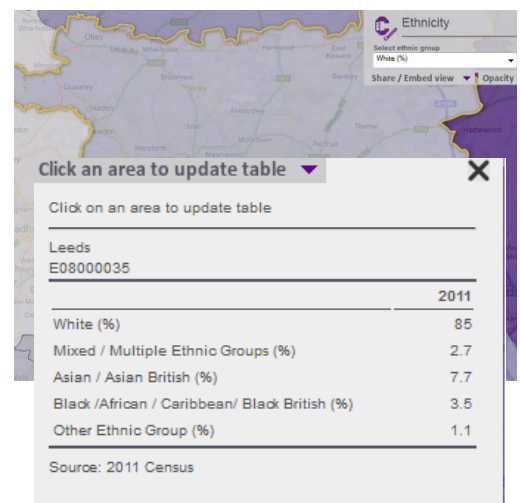
Zoom out one level by clicking



Click anywhere near Leeds and you will see the boundary of the area change. This is now the area for Leeds Local Authority (LA). Open the table of percentages and you will see this has changed.

In this larger area of Leeds 7.7 % of the population are Asian/Asian British.

NB: When it's a small area there will be a code after the name of the area, e.g. Leeds 111B. When a whole LA is displayed there will be just the name of the area.

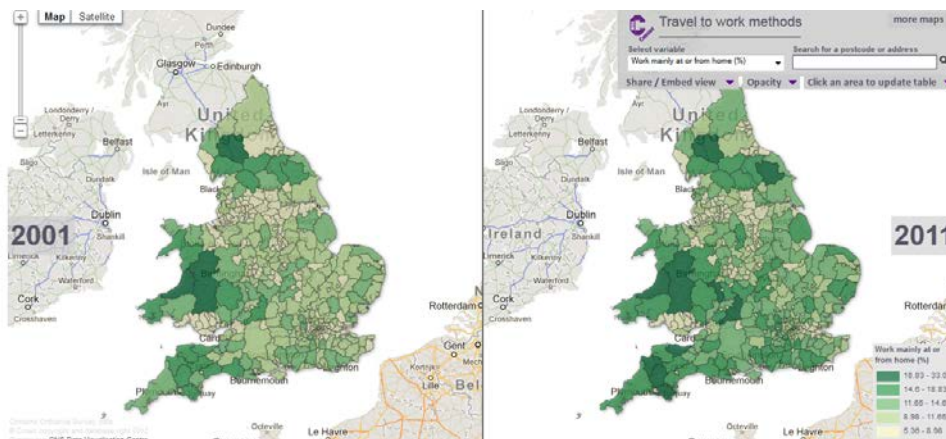


Show that the percentage of the population of the whole area of Birmingham who are White is 57.9.

NOTE:

Some of the Census Map Analyses have two maps while others have only one, as shown in the table below. Where there is only one map it is not possible to compare the two censuses as the classifications have changed. For example the question about ethnicity in Census 2011 had extra classifications such as Gypsy and Irish Traveller and Arab.

Also notice that in some of the tables where there are two maps it states

'The 2011 boundaries for the selected area are **different** compared with 2001 boundaries '.

This means they are not comparing exactly the same areas.
